Story The Fourth Commandment demands that we honor our father and mother.

Meaning This commandment can be a real challenge in its literal meaning—some of us have been hurt deeply by our parents. However we are still to keep this commandment literally by looking for the good in our parents and honoring that. On a deeper level, this commandment asks us to honor the Lord, our Father, and His church, our Mother—our real spiritual parents.

Task This week find a person that you wish to express gratitude to for their positive impact in your life. It may be that you wish to express your thanks to your parents or guardians or one of the people of the “Lord’s Church” that has nurtured you in some way in your life. Write a letter, make a phone call, or send a gift of thanks.
