Lesson 2.12: THE TEN COMMANDMENTS — Ex. 19: 1-25 and Ex. 20: 1-17

TEACHER PREPARATION

Read over Exodus 19: 1-25 and 20: 1-17.

WORSHIP CIRCLE

STORY AND DISCUSSION

Read story from the Children's Bible about Moses and show picture. Tell the children what the commandments are in simple terms. For example, for Honor thy father and thy mother say "be good to your parents." Go through each one and explain it. Then ask the children for examples.

The people traveled farther into the desert. One day, they came to some high mountains. Moses told them to wait there until he returned. Then he climbed up the steep rocks. He disappeared from view.

Moses was gone a long time. God spoke the words of the Ten Commandments to him. Then Moses returned. He told the people what God had said. They promised to obey the laws of the commandments.

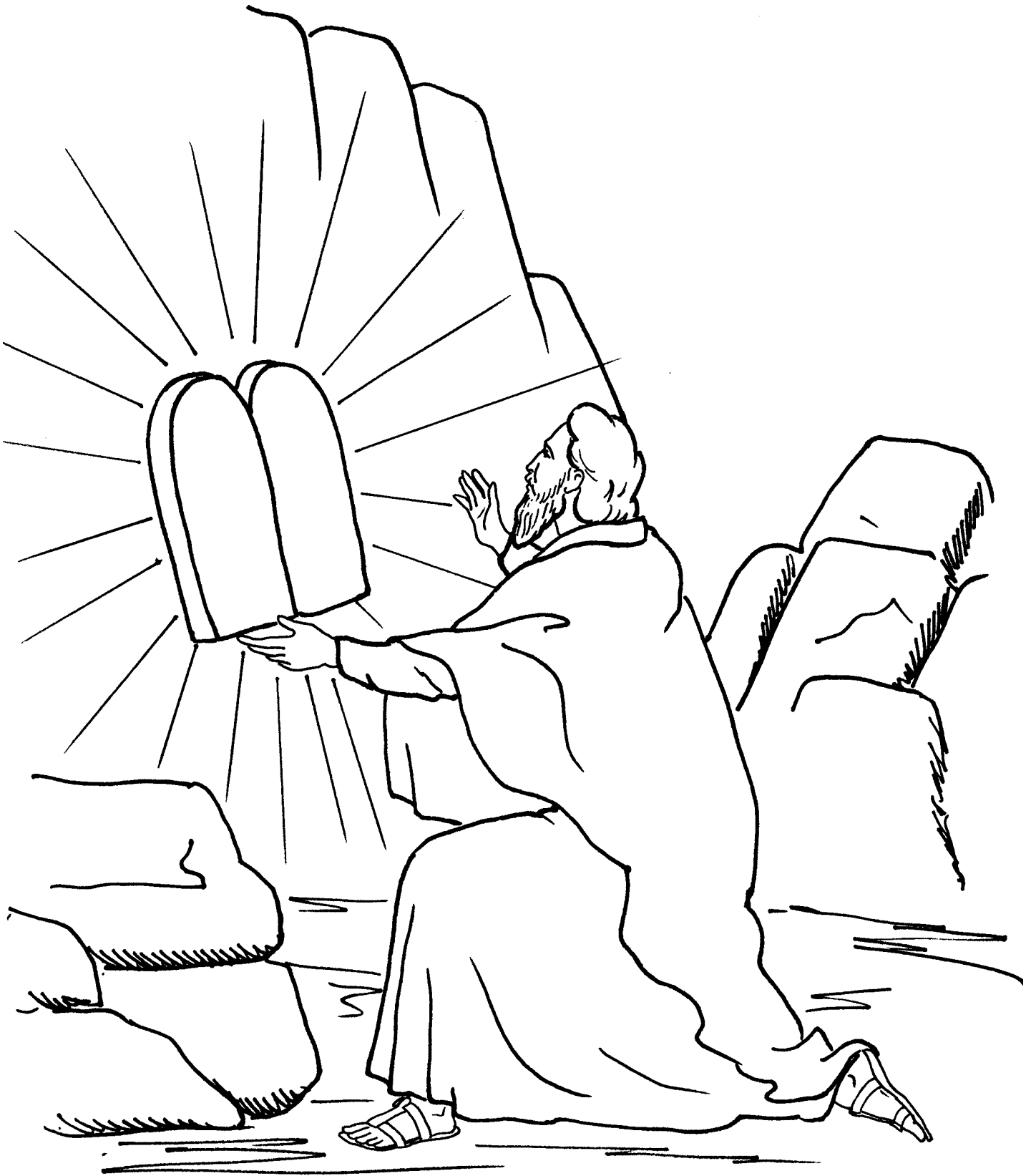
PROJECT

EXODUS 19:20 25:12

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

1. You shall have no other gods before Me.
2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
3. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
4. Honor your father and your mother.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
9. You shall not covet your neighbor's house.
10. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is your neighbor's.
