

LESSON 33 – CASCADE NEW CHURCH SUNDAY SCHOOL

Text: Seeing the Lord – The Walk to Emmaus – Luke 24:13-35

Recitation:

"Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him" (Luke 24:31).

Themes:

1. Talk about how the Lord's followers saw the Lord after He was risen.
 - a. The man they walked with was Jesus.
 - b. The tomb was empty when His followers went to see it, for the Lord was risen.
 - c. Understand that He was God, the King of Heaven and not just an earthly King.

Activities:

Make a portrait on shiny gold paper of the Lord as King of Heaven. Use construction paper and flesh colored paper and pens.



Next, staple on the top of the portrait a veil (a sheet of tracing paper through which one can still see the portrait). On the tracing paper, add a crown, scepter, etc. to make God into the "idea" of an earthly King. Also add some fake "jewels."

Above the portrait write the quote "The Lord is King of Heaven."

In addition, bring bread to break and share with the children to demonstrate that part of the story.

Adaptation for Toddlers:

Make tin foil crowns with "jewels" on them and paste on the same quote as above. To make them, cut 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of paper in half lengthwise, join ends and fold it all in half lengthwise. This is covered with tinfoil and secured with tape. Adjust the size to child's head and tape into a circle. Add jewels and quote. Talk about the Lord being King.
