Materials

a set of pages for each student colored pencils, markers, gel pens, or crayons tape (if making accordion book)

Procedure


- Illustrated the text on each page. Rather than trying to show the whole
 picture, you may want to focus on certain aspects of the story. For
 example, you could show the Lord breaking bread and not show the two
 men that He gives it to or you could show the Lord ascending into
 heaven but not show the watching disciples, or only show the backs of
 their heads.
- 2. Cut the pages as needed. Then fold the double pages along the line and tape them together to make an accordion book that can be put on display. (See the diagram below.)
