

Joseph Rules Egypt

Genesis 41:1-8, 14-15, 25-30, 33-35, 38-42, 46-49, 56-57 Ages 7-10

Life Focus: God has a plan for my life.

Memory Verse: Pharaoh said to Joseph, "There is no one as discerning and wise as you. You shall be over my house." Genesis 41:39, 40 (selections)

Level B

Story Summary: Pharaoh had two dreams. First, he saw seven healthy fat cows grazing. Then seven skinny cows came and ate up the fat cows. Next he saw seven plump heads of grain on a stalk. Seven blighted thin heads sprang up and devoured the seven full heads. Nobody could tell Pharaoh what the dreams meant. The butler then remembered Joseph, and he was brought out of prison to interpret the dreams. The dreams meant that there would be seven years of good harvest followed by seven years of famine. Joseph told Pharaoh to appoint a ruler to store food for the famine, and Pharaoh chose Joseph for this role. When the famine began, people came to Egypt to buy grain from Joseph.

the story as the children put the events in order. Read	Today we are learning about two more dreams in the story of Joseph. Pharaoh's dreams were not like our dreams. They were prophetic dreams. They showed something that would happen in the future. The Lord does not try to teach us about the future through dreams. Instead, He wants us to learn from the Word and to try to follow what it teaches each day.
Talk	What did Pharaoh see first? Seven fat healthy cows came out of a river to graze. Then seven very thin cows came out of the river and ate up the fat ones!
About It	What did Pharaoh see next? Seven fat and seven thin heads of grain. The thin heads ate up the fat ones.
	Pharaoh knew that his dreams were a message from the Lord. So he asked his wise men what they meant—but none of them could explain. What did the butler remember? Joseph had explained dreams and what he said had come true!
	So Joseph was brought out of prison, shaved, and given clean clothes. What did Joseph say when Pharaoh asked him to interpret his dreams? That the Lord really explained dreams.
	What did Pharaoh's dreams mean? There would be seven years when lots of food would grow and seven years when no food would grow and there would be a famine.
	What is it like to be hungry? Have you ever gone for a long time without food?
	What did Joseph tell Pharaoh to do? Store up food during the years of plenty so they could use it when there was a famine.
	Who did Pharaoh put in charge of this? Joseph. He became a ruler and was second only to Pharaoh in all of Egypt. He gathered in all the extra grain so that when the famine came people would have food.
	The Lord showed Joseph what he should do. The Lord shows us what we can do too! He has a plan for your life, just as He did for the people in Egypt. Where can you find the Lord's plan for your life? In His Word. His plan is for us to become angels in heaven.
	As we read the Word we can store up true and important ideas just as Joseph stored up grain in Egypt. When we learn and do what the Word teaches, we are following the Lord's plan to become an angel in heaven.

Choice A Crown of Life for Joseph


Joseph did what was good and right. As Potiphar's servant Joseph was successful and was made an overseer of his household affairs. Potiphar's wife made up a lie about Joseph and Potiphar sent him to prison. In spite of this, the Lord was with



Joseph and showed him mercy giving him favor in the eyes of the prison keeper. The prison keeper put him in charge of the other prisoners and, again, whatever Joseph did prospered. When Pharaoh brought Joseph out of prison, he faithfully explained the meaning of Pharaoh's dream and became a ruler second only to Pharaoh.

The book of Revelation says "Be faithful until death, and I will give you a crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). We will be make a crown that shows the many ways in which the Lord blessed Joseph for being a faithful servant.

- 1. Give each child 1 Joseph's Stars page (p. 41) and 1 My Stars page (p. 42).
- 2. Cut out the star shapes. *Optional*: if you printed the stars on colored paper, exchange stars with the same words to create colorful crowns.
- 3. On the blank *My Stars*, write additional things Joseph did, or blessings a person can receive by turning to the Lord and following His way, e.g. happiness, heaven, humility.
- 4. Staple or tape the stars into a circle to represent the "Crown of Life" Joseph gained by following the Lord. Wear the crown.



Pharaoh's dreams warned about a famine that could have devastating consequences for Egypt. The dreams also hold a message for us. We can store up the Word's treasures in our minds and hearts in order to stay spiritually healthy during life's hard times. Help students take this dream to heart by creating a mural depicting the dream and discussing its meaning in their lives.



Materials for each child

Joseph Stars and My Stars pp. 41-42 printed on heavy white or colored paper, scissors, tape or stapler, pens or pencils

optional: glue and glitter

Activity Hint!

To create colorful crowns, copy stars on to a variety of colors of stiff paper. Students can exchange stars of different colors to create crowns that are like Joseph's colorful coat.

Materials

colored paper, fabric or a bulletin board to create a background for the mural, scissors, glue, markers or crayons, *Pharaoh's Dreams Mural* pieces (pp. 43-51) for the class to share

optional: tissue paper to lay over the pictures to create a dream-like appearance, background papers or fabrics

Pharaoh's Dreams Mural continued

- 1. We will create a mural of Pharaoh's dreams. Each person will decorate and cut out part of the dream. We will arrange the pieces together as a mural that tells the story.
- 2. Distribute the pictures. Invite each child to choose one or more pictures to color and cut out.
- 3. Help the children lay out and assemble the mural to tell the story of the Dreams.

Hand out copies of the picture and invite the children to color it.

Customize Your Mural

Make multiple copies of the cows and grain. Create distance in the scene by enlarging or reducing various elements, such as people, trees, wise men, pillars, Egyptian frieze, etc. Create interest by adding 3-D materials such as textured flooring, see-through fabrics, etc. Add background elements, such as pyramids.


Check to see if the children know that 'discerning' means showing good judgment and understanding. Read the *Memory Verse* aloud. Repeat it slowly several times. Invite the children to say it with you. Say "Pharaoh said to Joseph." Ask the children to repeat it with you. Say "There is no one as discerning and wise as you." Ask the children to repeat it with you. Say "You shall be over my house." Say both sentences and have children repeat them several times.


Closing

The butler works for Pharaoh.	The baker dies.








Pharaoh's Dreams Mural





