The Wolf and the Lamb Shall Feed Together

Behold I create Jerusalem as a rejoicing, and her people a joy. I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and take joy in My people....
Then shall the wolf and the lamb feed together (Isaiah 65:18,25).

Directions

- 1) Color the lamb and the wolf on the following page.
- 2) Cut out the lamb and the wolf, with the paper tab hanging below.
- 3) On another piece of paper (an extra large piece of paper would be ideal) cut a slit half way down the page as illustrated above.
- 4) Insert the tabs of the lamb and the wolf so that they can slide toward each other.
- 5) It may be helpful to attach a popsicle stick to the back of each animal to make it easier to manipulate the figures.

Discussion ideas

Talk to your child(ren) about lambs and wolves.

- What is a lamb like? It is gentle, isn't it?
- ♦ What about a wolf? It is a fierce, wild animal. It would be more likely to hurt a lamb than to feed peacefully nearby.
- ♦ When people follow the teachings of the Lord's New Church, then they can experience peace and joy. Think how peaceful it can be in our family [or classroom] when we obey the Lord.
- This kind of peace is pictured by the lamb and wolf feeding together.

Optional: Describe some situations and ask your child(ren) to decide whether this is like the lamb and wolf needing to stay far apart or being able to come together, in peace and joy. Move the lamb and wolf to show which kind of situation it is.
